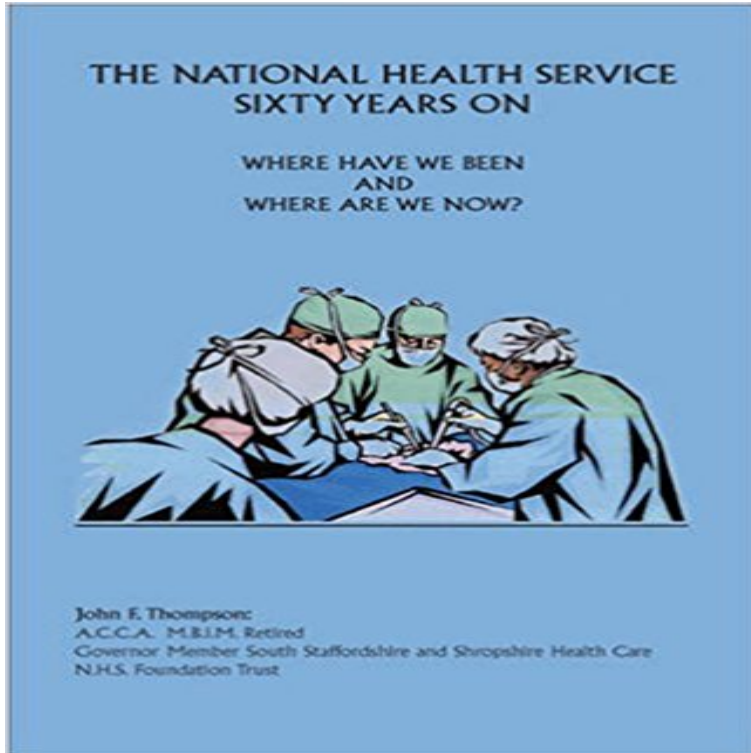


The National Health Service Sixty Years On: Where Have We Been and Where Are We Now?
