

OBSERVATIONS. The case of Henry Holland was very distinctly marked, and extremely obstinate, and the pain was very acute. He was bled, and had a blistering plaister applied, but was a xvery I very little relieved by either, though the latter produced a considerable discharge. He then took three drams of the

tincture of guaiacum twice in three days, which operated as a sudorific both times, but with no relief. He next made use of ...
